

SAPERE BIO PRIVACY POLICY

Sapere Bio, Inc., (“**Sapere Bio**”) values your privacy and the privacy of our other customers and visitors of our websites at www.saperex.com and www.saperebio.com (or successor URLs) (collectively, the “**Site**”), as well as the privacy of the clients that clinical customers serve.

Visitors to the Site are referred to individually as “**Site User**” and collectively as “**Site Users.**”

This Privacy Policy describes what information we gather, how we use that information, and what we do to protect it. By using the Site, you expressly consent to the information handling practices described in this policy.

This Privacy Policy is incorporated into and is subject to Sapere Bio’s Terms of Service. Your use of the Site and any personal information you provide on the Site are subject to the terms of this Privacy Policy and Sapere Bio’s Terms of Service. Please carefully review this Privacy Policy and the Terms of Service. By using our Services, you agree, accept, and consent to all of the policies and procedures described in these documents. If you do not agree with or are not comfortable with any aspect of this Privacy Policy or the Terms of Service, you should immediately discontinue use of our Services.

What We Do:

Sapere Bio provides testing services to help clinicians determine the impact of diverse health practices on cellular senescence and immune system aging (“Service” or “Sapere Bio Service”). We do not sell the Sapere Bio Service directly to consumers. To access our tools and Service, clinicians must first be approved by Sapere Bio as is described in the Terms of Service. Once a clinician is approved, they will have access to an Authorized Account, through which they can request tests for their clients.

Definitions:

We may collect “Personal Information” about users of this site, users of our Service, and client information that is submitted through our site by those with Authorized Accounts as part of our Service. This Personal Information amounts to any factual or subjective information, whether recorded or not, about an identifiable individual.

“Personal Information” or “Personal Data” is information about an individual that when used alone or with other relevant data can identify that individual (e.g., email address, first and last name, birthdate, home address, age, etc.).

“Sensitive Information” or “Sensitive Data” is a category of Personal Information or Personal Data of an individual relating to confidential medical facts, medical history, medical records, racial or ethnic origins, political or religious beliefs, or sexuality.

“Self-Reported Information” is all information provided to us about individuals, including input and answers to surveys, forms, questionnaires, email, features on our website and software applications, while participating in Services (through an approved clinician), Research Studies, or engaging with our customer service (“Customer Service”). In many cases, Self-Reported Information will be reported by an individual to a clinician as part of the Sapere Bio Service provided to that clinician. That clinician may then pass along part or all of that Self-Reported Information to us, as part of the Sapere Bio Service.

“Protected Health Information” or “PHI” is any information about health status, provision of health care, or payment for health care that can be linked to a specific individual that also includes such information as any part of a medical record or payment history.

“Registration Information” is collected both when a clinician applies for approval to use a Sapere Bio Service, and after a clinician is approved for that Sapere Bio Service. Registration Information includes, but is not limited to, Personal Information such as name, date of birth, password, payment information, shipping addresses, and contact information such as an email address and telephone number that the clinician provided to create a Sapere Bio Authorized Account used for the Service. Sapere Bio uses Registration Information to authenticate your access to your Sapere Bio Account, and Sapere Bio and SapereX websites for purposes that include, but are not limited to: use of the Service, enabling clinicians to order testing, marketing and communications, and certain other purposes.

“Biological Samples” are the blood samples collected by clinicians or Research Partners as part of the Sapere Bio Service or Research Studies. These blood samples are returned to Sapere Bio for testing and analysis.

“Sample Data” is data created from the Samples provided to Sapere Bio for testing and analysis. Sample Data analysis includes, but is not limited to, measuring the levels of gene expression for markers of cellular senescence and immune health and longevity.

“Medical Information” is information in medical records from clinicians or research partners that is provided to Sapere Bio as part of the Sapere Bio Service.

“User Content” is information that you create or content that you post or upload on our website, social media, or public forums that relate to us, such as blogs, data, text, software, documents, audio, photographs, graphics, video, messages, discussions, emails, or other materials that you create or provide to us through public or private transmissions.

“Test Data” is information we extract from Sample Data for use in our testing services that produce data and test results that help us provide accurate and personalized Service to our clinicians and research partners.

“De-identified Information” or “De-identified Data” is information that has been stripped of Personal Information (e.g., your name and contact information) and other identifying data such that one cannot reasonably be identified as an individual. De-identified Data as used in this Privacy Policy means data that cannot be attributed to you or a specific individual without the use of additional information, and that additional information is not accessible to the users of the data. Sapere Bio takes all reasonable precautions to avoid inadvertent identification of Samples and other Sensitive Data with their personal identifiers.

“Aggregate Information” or “Aggregate Data” is information that has been combined with information of other individuals and analyzed or evaluated as a whole, such that no specific individual may be reasonably identified. Aggregate Data is often used for data analysis and sometimes for Research.

“Individual-level Data” means information or data about a single individual's Sample or other types of data. Individual-level Data is not necessarily tied to Personal Information, and may be De-identified Information.

“Web Information” is information on how you use Sapere Bio’s website (e.g., browser type, domains, page views, etc.) or other online media owned by Sapere Bio, and are collected through log files, cookies, pixels, and web beacon technologies.

The Information Sapere Bio Collects:

- **User-Provided Information:** You may provide to Sapere Bio Personal Information (such as your name, email address, postal mailing address, information relating to your medical practice, or home/mobile telephone number) when using the Site. For example, if you use the Site to contact Sapere Bio, we will ask for your email address so that we can respond to you. Clinicians and Research partners may provide information, including, but not limited to, a client’s Medical Information and Personal Information through Authorized Accounts. Medical Information may or may not be de-identified when received from a clinician or Research partner.
- **“Cookies” Information:** When you visit the Site, we may send one or more cookies – small text files containing a string of alphanumeric characters – to your computer. Sapere Bio may use both session cookies and persistent cookies. A session cookie disappears after you close your browser. A persistent cookie remains after you close your browser and may be used by your browser on subsequent visits to the Site. Persistent cookies can be removed. Please review your web browser “Help” file to learn the proper way to modify your cookie settings. Please note that disabling cookies may prevent you from accessing some of the functionality and site offerings available via the Site.
- **“Automatically Collected” Information:** When you visit the Site, we may automatically record certain information from your web browser by using different types of technology, including “clear GIFs” or “web beacons.” This “automatically collected” information may include Internet Protocol address, web browser type, the web pages or sites that you visit just before or just after the Site, the pages you view on the Site, and the dates and times that you visit the Site.

The Way Sapere Bio Uses Information:

- Sapere Bio uses the information you provide or that we collect to operate, maintain, enhance, and provide all of the features and information found on the Site. We will use your email address, without further consent, for administrative purposes, for customer service purposes, and to address intellectual property infringement, rights of privacy, or defamation issues.

- Sapere Bio uses all of the information that we collect to understand and analyze the usage trends and preferences of our Site Users, to improve the way the Site works and looks, and to create new features and functionality.
- Sapere Bio may use Automatically Collected Information to: (a) remember your information so that you will not have to re-enter it during your visit or the next time you visit the Site; and (b) monitor aggregate site usage metrics such as total number of visitors and pages viewed.
- Sapere Bio may use your email address or other personally identifiable information to send promotional messages or otherwise contact you about Sapere Bio products and services or other information.
- Sapere Bio may use Information to develop new Sapere Bio products, inventions, and services, including the possibility of filing patent applications based on inventions that may include one or more of De-Identified Individual-Level Data, Test Data, Sample Data and Aggregate Information.
- Sapere Bio may use information to comply with our legal, licensing, contractual, and regulatory obligations.
- Sapere Bio may use Information as part of Sapere Bio Research, including, but not limited to, using Aggregate Information to improve existing Sapere Bio products and services.
- Sapere Bio may use information to provide Services, including, but not limited to, Services to clinicians and Research partners. Examples of how Sapere Bio may use information include, but are not limited to, analyzing Biological Samples, generating Sample Data, generating Test Data, communicating information to clinicians and Research partners regarding testing and analysis of Biological Samples, Sample Data, Test Data, and any other matters relevant to providing Sapere Bio Services.
- Sapere Bio may use information for quality control purposes.
- Sapere Bio may use information to provide customer support.

When Sapere Bio Discloses Information:

- Sapere Bio does not share your personally identifiable information with other organizations for their marketing or promotional uses without your express consent.
- Sapere Bio discloses automatically collected and other aggregate non-personally-identifiable information with interested third parties to assist such parties in understanding the usage, viewing, and demographic patterns for certain programs, content, services, advertisements, promotions, and/or functionality on the Site.
- Sapere Bio works with some authorized service providers to provide website hosting and maintenance as well as other services for us. To the extent it is necessary for these service providers to complete their contractual obligations to Sapere Bio; these third parties may have access to or process your personally identifiable information. While Sapere Bio adheres to the statements set forth in this Privacy Policy with regard to your

personally identifiable information, this Privacy Policy does not apply to, and Sapere Bio has no control over (and is not responsible for) the activities of such third-party providers.

- Sapere Bio may also disclose information if required to do so by law or in the good-faith belief that such action is necessary to comply with state and federal laws or respond to a court order, judicial or other government subpoena, or warrant. In some cases, we may make such disclosures without first providing notice to others.
- Sapere Bio also reserves the right to disclose information that we believe, in good faith, is appropriate or necessary to take precautions against liability; protect Sapere Bio from fraudulent, abusive, or unlawful uses; to investigate and defend ourselves against any third-party claims or allegations; to assist government enforcement agencies; to protect the security or integrity of the Site; or to protect the rights, property, or personal safety of Sapere Bio, our Site Users, our Customers and their clients, or others.
- Sapere Bio may disclose information with your express written permission.
- Sapere Bio may disclose some information as part of the ordinary course of business operations. For example, when Sapere Bio ships testing supplies, addresses and names may be disclosed to third-party shipping companies as part of the ordinary course of business. Such service providers may use information for their internal operations including data analysis and improving their services in general. While Sapere Bio adheres to the statements set forth in this Privacy Policy with regard to your personally identifiable information, this Privacy Policy does not apply to, and Sapere Bio has no control over (and is not responsible for) the activities of such third-party providers.
- Sapere Bio will disclose information when communicating with clinicians and Research partners. For example, after a clinician orders a Sapere Bio Service for a client of that clinician, Sapere Bio will communicate instructions to that clinician, provide that clinician with testing supplies, receive a Biological Sample from the clinician, and return the analysis and test results from that Biological Sample to that clinician. There may be further follow on conversations between Sapere Bio and that clinician following the clinician's receipt of the analysis and test results.
- Sapere Bio may disclose information as part of a merger, acquisition, or sale of all or part of its assets.
- Sapere Bio may disclose information when publishing Research or during Research presentations. Information disclosed in this way will be de-identified, and, in most cases, Aggregate Information, such that individuals cannot reasonably be identified in any Research presentations, studies, or publications.
- Sapere Bio may disclose Aggregate Information publicly or share it with third parties.

Your Choices and this Site:

You may, of course, decline to share your personally identifiable information with Sapere Bio when you visit one of our websites, in which case Sapere Bio will not be able to provide to you some of the features and functionality found on that Site.

Additional Rights:

Privacy laws and rights are changing rapidly, with many states recently passing their own regulations regarding privacy, and many other states considering making similar changes. Residents of certain states, including California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Iowa, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Virginia, and Washington may have additional rights with regard to Privacy and Personal Information. Sapere Bio will comply with all requests under state law to remove information, to respond to requests from Users regarding our disclosure of personal information to third parties, or other requests made under such laws, with the exception that we will not remove information if we are required to retain that information under Federal laws, rules, and regulations. For example, we will not remove information that we are required to maintain under the record retention requirements of the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (“CLIA”). To make such a request, please contact customer service regarding your request.

Requests to Remove Information:

You may submit a request to delete your Personal Information by contacting us by email through our Site. Once you submit your request, and we verify that your request is valid (i.e., coming from you and not a third party), we will send an email confirmation to you at the email address that you specify in your request. Once you confirm your request to delete your personal information, we will delete the information from our records. This process cannot be cancelled, undone, withdrawn, or reversed. All associated Personal Information will be deleted, subject to the following limitation:

- Information previously included in Sapere Bio Research. Any information used in Research cannot be removed from studies that use that information.
- Legal Retention Requirements. Sapere Bio will retain Medical Information, Sample Data, test reports, date of birth, and sex as required for compliance with applicable legal obligations, including under CLIA. Sapere Bio will also retain limited information related to your data deletion request, including but not limited to, your email address, account deletion request, communications related to inquiries or complaints, and legal agreements for a limited period of time as required by law, contractual obligations, or as necessary for the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims and for audit and compliance purposes.

Our Commitment to Children’s Privacy:

Protecting the privacy of young children is especially important. For that reason, Sapere Bio does not knowingly collect or maintain personally identifiable information on Site from persons under 13 years of age, and no part of the Site is directed to persons under 13. IF YOU ARE UNDER 13 YEARS OF AGE, THEN PLEASE DO NOT USE OR ACCESS THE SITE AT ANY TIME OR IN ANY MANNER. If Sapere Bio learns that personally identifiable information of persons less than 13 years of age has been collected by Sapere Bio, then Sapere Bio will take the appropriate steps to delete this information.

Our Commitment to Data Security:

Sapere Bio uses commercially reasonable physical, managerial, and technical safeguards to preserve the integrity and security of your personal information. We cannot, however, ensure or warrant the security of any information you transmit to Sapere Bio, and you do so at your own risk. Once we receive your transmission of information, Sapere Bio makes commercially reasonable efforts to ensure the security of our systems. However, please note that this is not a guarantee that such information may not be accessed, disclosed, altered, or destroyed by breach of any of our physical, technical, or managerial safeguards.

You acknowledge and agree that protecting Information (including, but not limited to, Personal Information and Medical Information) is a responsibility shared between you and Sapere Bio. In this regard, we ask all users of our Sapere Bio Service to be responsible for keeping their login IDs, passwords, and other authentication information used to access the Service in a secure manner and maintain strict confidentiality. You should not share Authorized Account and authentication information with any third parties and should inform Sapere Bio immediately of any prohibited use of your Authorized Account or authentication information. Sapere Bio cannot secure and assumes no liability for information that is released by our users to third parties.

International Visitors:

Personally identifiable information collected on the Site may be stored and processed in the United States or any other country in which Sapere Bio or its affiliates, subsidiaries, or agents maintain facilities, and by using the Site you consent to any such transfer of information outside of your country.

In the Event of Merger or Sale:

In the event that Sapere Bio is acquired by or merged with a third-party entity, we reserve the right, in any of these circumstances, to transfer or assign the information that we have collected from Users as part of such merger, acquisition, sale, or other change of control without prior notice to you.

Changes and Updates to this Privacy Policy:

This Privacy Policy may be revised periodically without further notice to you, and this will be reflected by a “last modified” date below. Please revisit this page to stay aware of any changes. In general, we only use your personal information in the manner described in the Privacy Policy in effect when we received that personal information. Your continued use of the Site constitutes your agreement to this Privacy Policy and any future revisions.

For revisions to this Privacy Policy that may be materially less restrictive on our use or disclosure of personal information you have provided to us, we will make reasonable efforts to notify you and obtain your consent before implementing such revisions with respect to such information.

Terms of Service:

This Privacy Policy is part of, and is incorporated by reference into, the Sapere Bio Terms of Service (found on the Site). In case of any conflict between this Privacy Policy and the Terms of Service, the provisions found in the Terms of Service shall prevail.
